## **Art Display Writing Competition**

The Matthews Opera House invites you to participate in a writing contest celebrating creativity and our local artists, all inspired by the Spearfish Big Read, giving writers a chance for their work to be seen in our gallery and heard aloud. Professional and amateur writers of all ages are eligible to submit stories and there are no entry fees. We are seeking original stories that represent one of three selected pieces of art from local artists, Michael Knutson, Tim Petterson and sculptor Hunter Smith. To be considered for this award, stories need to take ONE of the three pieces, and create a full story on the scenes that these artist have created.

By submitting an entry to the Writing Contest, entrants certify that their participation is not illegal or in violation of any law, regulation, treaty or administrative act, and that the laws of their governing jurisdiction of residence at the time of entry do not prohibit or restrict the receipt of any Prize under this Writing Contest.

### **How to Submit**

- A writer may submit one story based on one piece of art
- Please submit via PDF or in hand at the Matthews Opera House and Art Center
- Please keep the stories within 4,000 words (roughly 8 pages single spaced, or 16 pages double spaced)
- Please include for each entry: name, title, date, mailing address, email, phone number and which piece you chose to write about

#### Winners

Prizes will be given to three stories, one representing each piece of art, to be featured throughout the Big Read, in the gallery and during the Short Story Stage Reading on March 15th. Only one winner will be selected for each piece of art.

- \$100 Cash Prize for each winner
- Artistic Credit in the gallery and on our website
- Recognition in all press releases including The Matthews monthly newsletter
